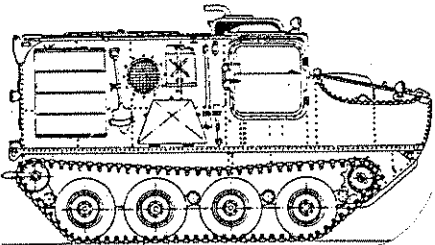
Some BOAT/U.S. members navigate to the beat of a different drummer. Jack Tomlin of Utah is certainly a case in point. Tomlin buys and restores surplus U.S. military all-terrain vehicles and has been traveling throughout Europe this year in a World War II-vintage amphibious vehicle called a DUKW (below). Tomlin has also formed the DUKW Yachting Club of America.

"My boating adventures are a bit different than anyone else's," he recently wrote to BOAT/U.S. "This year I have traveled by sea from Copenhagen to Oslo to Stockholm to Leningrad, some 800 miles."

A French magazine recounting Tomlin's adventures said he drove the DUKW across the English Channel and arrived in Calais to the astonishment of French Customs officials.

He drove down French highways and reportedly alarmed some townspeople who thought he might be a scout vehicle for an approaching army. Tomlin has traveled to numerous World War II 50th anniversary events in Europe. His goal is to park

his DUKW in front of McDonald's in Red Square and take pictures. We certainly hope he sends us one.
