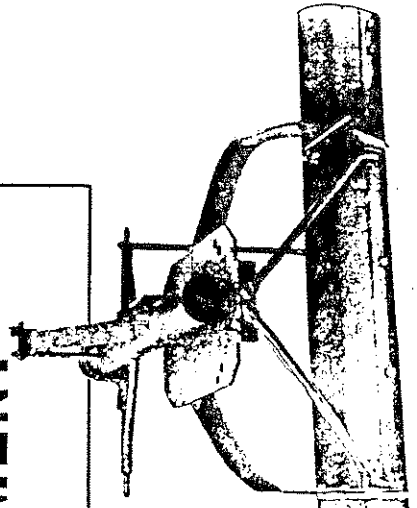

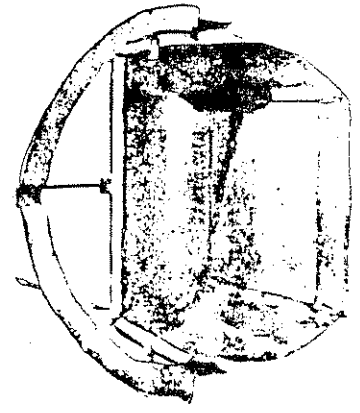

Jeep accessories, part 18: With Fall approaching we will soon be back to leaf raking. Last month we started a (hypothetical) swimming pool project. Now we need to finish this before the weather turns cold. Lets use more of the Jeep Earth Moving equipment as described by Willys forty years ago. Here we have a terracing blade and a scoop. With the drag and limited (note that I did not say limitless) power of the faithful MB, one wonders how long an engine would last with these jobs. On the other hand maybe Willys hoped to sell many replacement engines. Well, happy digging.

FEATURES OF 'Jeep' TERRACING BLADE

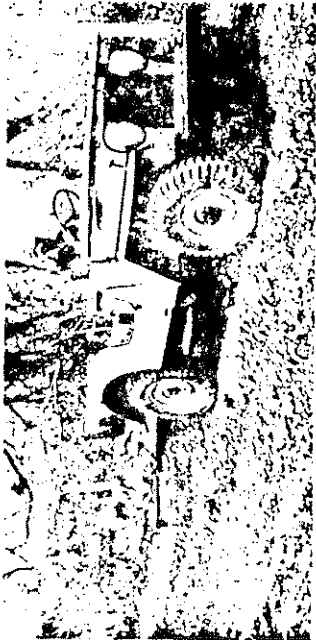
Attaches to 'Jeep' Tractor or Farm 'Jeep' in 2 minutes or less.
Blade may be set at any angle - even at a full circle.
Blade weight 350 lbs.
Reverse blade and use as a bulldozer.
Operation control from the driver's seat.
Moldboard length 6' -- 3/8" thick.
Reversible cutting edge.

FEATURES OF 'Jeep' SCOOP

Attaches to 'Jeep' Tractor or Farm 'Jeep' in 2 minutes or less.
Scoop can be reversed with available attachments. This permits backward digging and loading and easy dumping over the edge of a ditch or completely against a wall.
Scoop capacity is 6 cubic feet.
Scoop weight 185 lbs.

Both the 'Jeep' Scoop and the 'Jeep' Terracing Blade are designed to operate effectively with the Farm 'Jeep' and 'Jeep' Tractor and all tractors using the standard 3 point implement attachment system.

FAST, ECONOMICAL EARTH MOVING



The 'Jeep' Terracing Blade is a general purpose earth moving blade or grader which has a place on every farm or ranch. It may be used on such jobs as:

- Building terraces
- Maintaining terraces
- Road grading
- Snow removal from roads, streets, playgrounds, airports, etc.
- Cleaning feed lots and feeding floors
- Cleaning drainage ditches
- Digging drainage ditches
- Landscaping
- Farm and ranch road maintenance
- Blade may be reversed and used as a Bulldozer to push dirt into ditches or around building foundations



The 'Jeep' Scoop has many uses - among them:

- Excavating
- Cleaning ditches
- Filling holes
- Digging ponds
- Grading and landscaping
- Building roadbeds
- Other earth moving jobs
